We are excited to start the school year with a 5-year contract, retroactive from July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2027. However, because of the Yonkers Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA), the City Council oversees the Yonkers Public Schools Finance Department. While they have no authority over our contract, they vote on releasing funds to the Yonkers Public Schools when needed. The City Council was scheduled to vote on releasing the funds in July and then postponed it. As of this writing, we have reached out to the interim superintendent, the Board's attorneys, Yonkers City Council and the Mayor. We have been informed that the City Council has placed it on their agenda for September.

Our members know we are stronger when we stay together. No single member can accomplish what we have been able to accomplish jointly. I wish you a productive school year.

Dental Claims

- Dental forms must be signed, we require a signature and do not accept "signature on file."
- When a dental form is returned to the member for signature it <u>must be signed and returned upon receipt</u>. There is a one-year filing deadline from the actual date of service. <u>Delays in returning the signed form may lead to non-payment of claim</u>.
- Participating dentists are under contract with the YFT Welfare Fund to accept the negotiated fees as payment in full and there should be no copays. If you are going to a participating dentist, at NO TIME DO YOU MAKE ANY PAYMENT TO THEM UNLESS IT IS A SERVICE NOT COVERED OR YOU HAVE REACHED THE MAXIMUM ALLOWED FOR THAT PROCEDURE. If you have been asked to pay for covered services, please contact the Welfare Fund to confirm your patient responsibility.
- Dental Payments: <u>Please be sure to sign Dental Claim Forms correctly</u>. Payments are made according to where the signature appears on the Dental Claim Form. If payments are made to the dentist in error, it is your responsibility to get the payment back from the dentist.

All dental claims need to be completed by the dentist that provided the services.

Pre-Authorizations:

Pre-authorization is required for **all claims over \$500 with x-rays**. If you fail to pre-authorize major procedures, you will be eligible to appeal. **Appeals are once per lifetime**. Any future procedures performed without pre-authorization, cannot be appealed.

Pre-authorizations are required before any of the following procedures are performed:

Crowns, Implants, Bridges, Occlusal Guards and Orthodontics (braces).

While Pre-authorizations are not required for **Extractions** or **Root Canals the following** is required:

For Extractions, an x-ray is needed to demonstrate why it was extracted.

For Root Canals, pre-op and post-op x-rays are required when Root Canal Therapy is completed.

Orthodontics:

Welfare Fund Benefits only cover metal braces. If you choose Invisalign braces, they are not covered by the Plan and will not be reimbursed.

X-Rays:

Panoramic or Full Mouth Series x-rays are allowed once every 3 years and they share frequency.

CT Scans/Cone Beam Scans are not covered by the Plan and you would be responsible for any fees incurred.

Implants/Abutments:

• Custom Abutment (*code# 6057*)- The member is responsible to pay \$300 to the dentist and the Fund will pay \$165 to the dentist- this only applies to Implant Crowns.

Welfare Fund General Information:

A new Welfare Fund card must be completed and supporting documentation must be submitted for the following:

- *New members and members who change their status (i.e. Teacher/TA/Reg. Sub)
- *Members who have undergone changes in marital status through marriage (marriage certificate is required to cover your spouse), divorce (must provide court document to remove ex) or death of spouse.
- *To add a dependent child (through birth or adoption) to benefits (copy of birth certificates of children are required).
- *To change the beneficiaries of your \$5,000 death benefit.
- *To change/update your mailing address.
- *For a change in legal name (Please note, you must use the same name on Welfare Fund claims as the name used with the Yonkers Board of Education.)

Welfare Fund Benefits are provided to dependent children to 19 years of age ONLY. However, if your child is a full-time student, benefits continue until they graduate school to the maximum of 25 years of age. Please call the Welfare Fund for the form to continue the benefits.

Hearing Aid Benefits and Prescription Appliance Claims

Hearing Aid Benefits and Prescription Appliance Claims must first be submitted to primary medical insurance <u>before</u> being submitted to the Welfare Fund.

Optical Claims

• Unlike the prescription drug claims, the claims for optical do not have to be held to the end of the year. Please submit the claim at the time of service.

As of 01/01/2023, the optical reimbursement benefit increased for **members to a maximum of** \$200 per calendar year. For dependents, the benefit increased to a maximum of \$125 per calendar year.

Please note, the Welfare Fund provides benefits to over 3,000 Teachers, Administrators and Retirees. We also provide benefits to their dependents. There are only three people working in the Welfare Fund Office. **Please be patient**, we are working as hard as we can.


